Welcome to beautiful Banff!



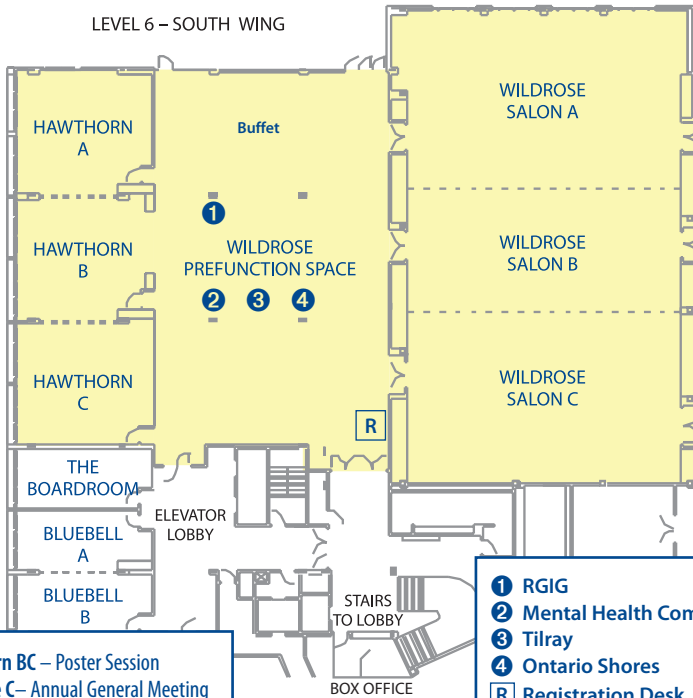
