

## **Dre Marie-Andrée Bruneau**

Dre Marie-Andrée Bruneau obtained a graduate degree in psychiatry in 2001, as well as a master's degree in biomedical sciences from University of Montreal Faculty of Medicine. Her master's thesis was on obsessionality in Parkinson's disease. Certified as a geriatric psychiatrist by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in 2013, Dr. Bruneau is also a Full Professor at the Psychiatry Department University of Montreal and



the Executive Director of the Department's Geriatric Psychiatry division. Researcher at the Institut Universitaire de Gériatrie de Montréal (IUGM) Research Center, Dr. Bruneau also leads a BPSD (behavioral and psychological symptoms of dementia) program at the IUGM. In this role, she works with the Health Ministry of Quebec in several projects involving the review of services, clinical training and the creation of clinical tools and practice guides. Her main clinical and research interests are psychiatric disorders associated with Parkinson's disease, behavioural and psychological symptoms of dementia, and delayed-onset psychiatric manifestations.
